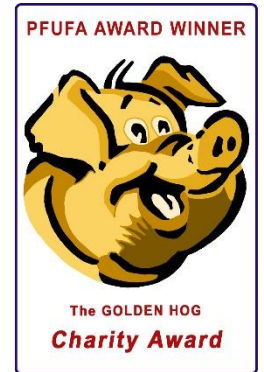


2023 Golden Hog Charity Award

2023 AWARD RECIPIENT – Lamar Scott, Atlanta Falcons

This year the Pro Football's Ultimate Fan Association awarded the 2023 Golden Hog Award to Lamar Scott. Lamar is a member of the PFUFA Class of 2016 and is being recognized for exemplifying the conventional definition of charity that is "the practice of giving and caring."

Lamar Scott has impacted his community in many ways, through his service as a board member for both Cool Girls, a nonprofit after school program for girls, as well as the Atlanta Youth Tennis and Education Foundation.

He is the current President of the Atlanta Lawn Tennis Association (ALTA).

Prior to assuming his current volunteer position, he was awarded the ALTA President's Award in 2019 and 2021. He has also been recognized with the USTA Georgia Professional Tennis Association Community Outreach Award.

Lamar works with kids through such programs as Serve and Connect. He is an annual volunteer for the Georgia Special Olympics, the North America Special Olympics Tennis Championships, the PTR Wheelchair Championships and the BB&T Atlanta Open.

Lamar also organizes tailgate parties at the Ronald McDonald House and helps organize the Toys for Tots annual collections. Lamar actively volunteers at the local TFT center organizing and distributing the toys.
